


We have a **writing** lesson four times a week. In writing, we will be learning about a range of fiction and non-fiction texts.

This half term, we will be looking at a story called 'The Proudest Blue'. It is a picture book about a young girl. It's Faizah's first day of school, and her older sister Asiya's first day of hijab - made of a beautiful blue fabric. But not



everyone sees hijab as beautiful. In the face of hurtful, confusing words, will Faizah find new ways to be strong? The children will be writing a diary entry for the perspective of Asiya.

<u>Key Vocabulary:</u> Hijab, bullying, equality, emotive language, informal language,



We will also be reading some of the tales from Arabian Nights. The children will be writing their own narrative piece using high level adjectives, different sentence starters and sentence types.

We have a **Maths** lesson every day. In maths we are learning to: Place Value

- Identify the value of digits in up to four digit numbers.
- Compare increasingly large numbers using <> and =.
- Order increasingly large numbers.

Addition and Subtraction

Add and subtract 2 3-digit numbers with 2 exchanges.

And finally, consolidation of the concepts taught in previous years.

#### Reading

Ensure that your child reads to you for at least 10 minutes at home every day and you record this in their reading record. Once we see that your child has read at home to an adult they will be able to change their reading book and will receive dojos.

Here are a list of questions you could ask to support your child's reading:
What might happen in the next part of the story?
What characters are in the story?
Can you order the main events in the story?
What is benneying in the picture?

What is happening in the picture? How is the character feeling?

Which was your favourite part of the story? Why?

What have you learnt from this non-fiction book? What is the purpose of the contents page/glossary/index?
