# **Social Media APPS and Online Gaming**



Facebook Minimum age: 13

Facebook's privacy settings let your child control who sees their posts and timeline.

- How does my profile appear?

**Instagram** *Minimum age: 13*

### Snapchat Minimum age: 13

**YouTube** Minimum age: 13 for an account, no minimum to watch videos

With over 400 hours of content uploaded to YouTube every minute, inevitably some of this content will be inappropriate for younger viewers. Because of the amount of content being uploaded to the site, other filters (including filters through your internet provider) may not function effectively enough for YouTube. ## YouTube Kids aged 12 and under

Google recently launched the YouTube Kids app, designed to offer only child-friendly content. You can't make comments or upload your own videos to YouTube Kids.

Parents can also turn off the search feature and set a time limit for how long their children can browse.

All the videos on YouTube Kids should be appropriate for children, but if you come across something you think has made it through by mistake, you can report it. Tap the **menu** icon at the top of the video player, choose **Report** and then choose **Yes**.

## What is WhatsApp?

WhatsApp is free to download messenger app for smartphones. WhatsApp uses the internet to send messages, images, audio or video. The service is very similar to text messaging services; however, because WhatsApp uses the internet to send messages, the cost of using WhatsApp is significantly less than texting. You can also use Whatsapp on your desktop, simply go to the Whatsapp website and download it to Mac or Windows. It is popular with teenagers because of features like group chatting, voice messages and location sharing. UPDATE: WhatsApp has changed its terms of service, raising the minimum age at which you can use the service from 13 to 16 years of age across Europe. Under the new E.U General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), Ireland has now set the Digital Age of Consent to 16 years old. This means young people under the age of 16 in Ireland are not allowed to access this platform.

Yubo Minimum age: 13

Yubo, formerly Yellow, is a social media app encouraging teens to find new friends by allowing them to swipe left or right to connect and live stream.

Now with over 15 million users, a change of name and new safety features to give users a safer experience, creators of Yubo are seeking to address the safety concerns that were raised about the app when it was first launched in 2015.

TikTok – which used to be called Musical.ly. Minimum age: 13

TikTok is a social networking app that young people can use to generate and share their own short videos and lip sync to popular audio clips. The app allows users to create and upload videos, remix existing videos using in-built editing tools, and also to view and comment on videos created by other users.

Parental Controls for Xbox One can be set for each of your children's individual profiles, allowing you to prevent unauthorised purchases, ensuring your children only access age-appropriate content and restrict the ability to chat to strangers online.

#### **XBOX LIVE**

Xbox Live Privacy Settings allow you to control how your child interacts with other players online and how much content they're exposed to. You can also add individual Xbox Live restrictions through your Xbox 360 and Xbox 360 One settings.

## **Playstation 4**

The PS4 parental controls allow you to restrict games and apps that have mature content. You can disable the internet browser, customise content displayed in the Store and restrict how your child chats and interact on the PlayStation Network.

The PS3 Parental Controls allow you to restrict games and DVDs with mature content, use of the internet browser and how your child can chat and interact on the PlayStation Network.

The PS Vita Parental Controls can make the handheld console safer for your children by restricting games or videos with mature content, disabling the internet browser and blocking adult sites, and restricting how your child can chat on the PlayStation Network.
