
this term, which will develop our Art, Music, Computing and social skills.



How you can help

- Talk with your child about their day.
- The children are bringing reading books home. Find a time of day when your child can read to you for 5 minutes, and make it part of your routine ('little and often' is better for young readers).
- Use everyday opportunities to look at letter sounds, words and numbers (count the cars as they go past, look for numbers around the shops, write birthday cards, write a shopping list, spot different letters on signs. etc).
- Ensure your child has everything they need for their school day, and that they arrive on time. The school gate opens at 8.35am. We will open the classroom door at 8.40am and the children are expected to be in their classroom for self registration by 8.50 am.
- We have PE on Friday morning. Please ensure your child has their PE kit in school.

Literacy

This term we will be looking at Supertato,
The Great Chinese Race, Topsy and Tim
People who help us, Olivers vegetables,

First. Through our literacy we learn a range
of new vocabulary and explore both fiction

and non fiction books. We will discuss what is happening and predict what we think might happen next.



We will continue to work on our phonics, learning new sounds and applying these to our reading and writing. We are beginning to write captions and simple sentences using cvc words and the harder to read and spell words.

To be a successful reader, your child will need to practise reading at home every day. Children who practise the most, and have stories read to them regularly will generally become more confident readers, and find reading enjoyable.

Mathematics

We will continue to learn our numbers up to 10, this term, noticing what happens to the number if we add one more or have 1 less. We will add different numbers together and take numbers away. We will also look at the vocabulary linked to time and measuring,
