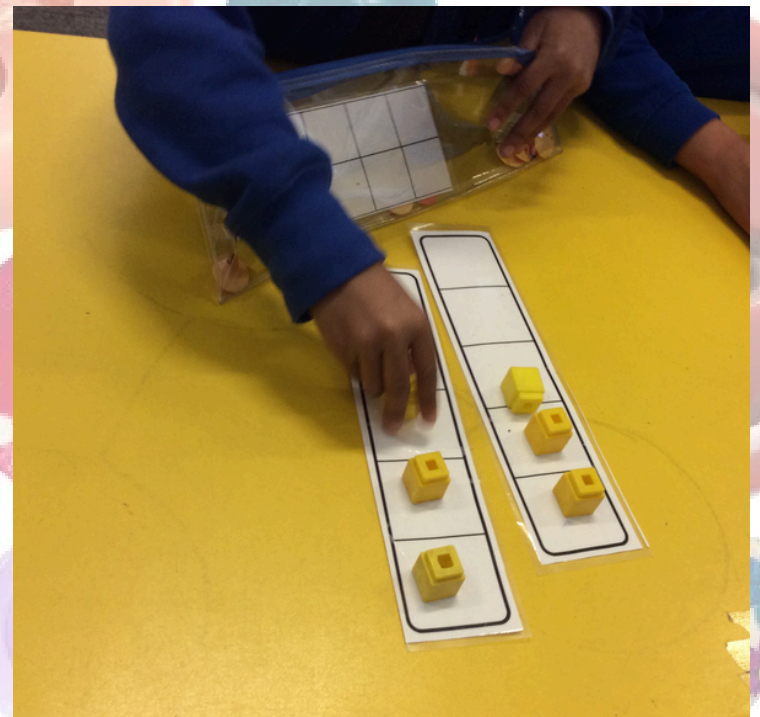

EYFS

This half term in EYFS Maths, we have been learning all about sharing, halving, and even and odd numbers. The children have enjoyed using objects to share fairly and find halves of different amounts. We have also explored even and odd numbers by making pairs and identifying when one is left over.

It has been wonderful to see the children developing their mathematical understanding through play, discussion and problem-solving activities.



Year 2

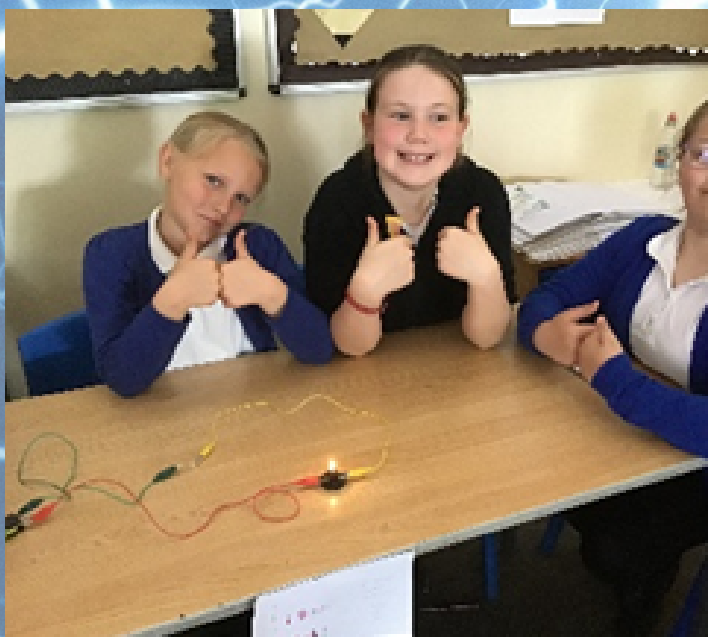
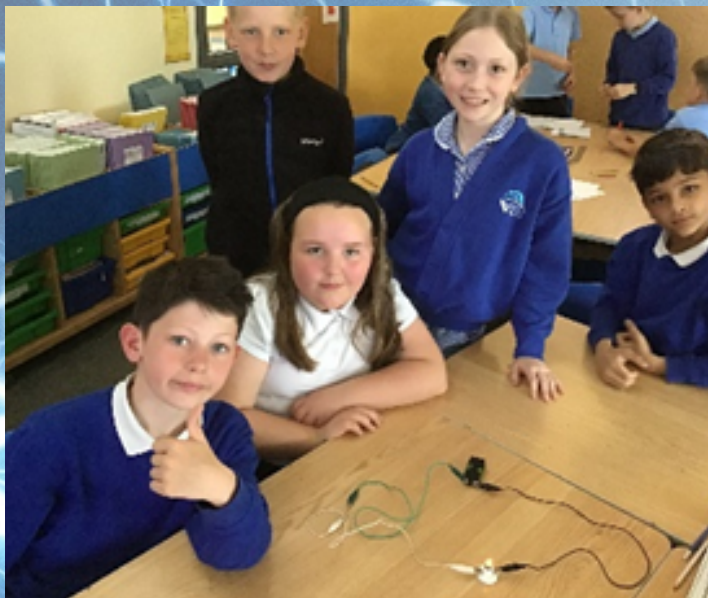
In Computing, Year 2 have been developing their programming skills through a range of exciting activities. The children explored how to design programs using timed sequences and learned how to use the timer-after command to create actions in a specific order. They also began using collision detection code blocks, helping them understand how objects can interact within a program. As part of their learning, pupils investigated different object types in 2Code and discovered that objects can have different attributes and properties. The children enjoyed changing object attributes and creating their own programs using a variety of object types.



Year 4

Year 4 have been exploring electricity this half term and have been developing their understanding of electrical circuits and how electricity works. In the lesson shown, the children investigated which materials are electrical conductors and which are insulators. They carried out practical tests using a range of materials and discussed why conductors are used to allow electricity to flow, while insulators are important for safety and preventing electric shocks.

The children showed excellent curiosity and teamwork throughout the investigation.



Year 6

Year 6 have shown fantastic determination and resilience during their SATs week! We are all incredibly proud of all the hard work and effort they have put in throughout the year. To celebrate, the children enjoyed a well-deserved pizza treat followed by a chilled cinema morning with their friends. It was a lovely way to recognise their achievements and mark the end of a busy and successful week. Well done Year 6! 😊
